IDEAL CANDIDATES WILL:

- Assess and make quick evaluations for risk, develop safety plans and respond within its outlined parameters, formulating and performing crisis intervention ensuring the safety of clients as necessary.
- Develop a trusting and caring relationship with clients to create a safe therapeutic environment and assist them in developing insight into themselves, their patterns, and their relationships.
- Guide clients in the development of skills and/or strategies for managing problems and triggers to increase relapse prevention and reduce risk.
- Counsel clients about their mental or physical illness, abuse, trauma, and inform clients about available community and social resources.
- Responsible for communicating treatment recommendations, ensuring recommendations are being addressed, and communicating updates to the client care team.
- Produce high-quality documentation such as clients' diagnostic records, reports, and paperwork while maintaining client confidentiality.
- Reflect all billable activity via case notes on clinic management software entered within 24 hours after each session.
- Use clear and accurate verbal and written communication skills to facilitate communication with clients, client's family/caregivers, staff, and treatment team.
- Efficiently accept client handoffs from other therapists/counsellors and seamlessly continue care.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Master's or Doctorate in psychology, social work, or other behavioural health disciplines from an accredited college or university with one or more years of experience in the clinical and behavioural health field providing, developing, implementing, and administering quality care.
- Registered with the applicable provincial governing body with the ability to provide autonomous psychotherapy services in that province or territory.
- Able to provide proof of professional liability insurance and 2 professional references
